

Students will study and learn normal and abnormal behavior, learning, development and cognition, as well as how to conduct research in psychology. As a psychology major at Thomas More University, students will attend small classes, usually with less than 25 students, and become acquainted with both applied and scientific aspects of the field. Students will have the opportunity to intern at a hospital, social service agency, or in industry. Students also can conduct and present research at an undergraduate conference and to engage in service projects related to the major. Such experiences contribute to the student's success in entering graduate school or the workforce.
